## BREAKING THE ICE: COOPERATION FOR SAFE AND RESPONSIBLE ARCTIC SEA ROUTES

World Ocean Council and EU Polar Cluster Members Co-Organize Breakout Session at Arctic Circle 2019 (Reykjavík, 10-13 October)

The World Ocean Council (WOC) as an ARICE Partner is collaborating with other members of the EU Polar Cluster KEPLER, ARCSAR and with ExtremeEarth in the organization of the session "Breaking the Ice: Cooperation for Safe and Responsible Exploitation of Arctic Sea Routes" at the <u>Arctic Circle 2019</u>.
